

The Office of Community Development provides funding to nonprofit organizations, local governments, and public housing authorities to administer programs to help homeless Ohioans to obtain permanent supportive housing quickly and to help Ohioans facing homelessness stay in their homes.



HOMELESS CRISIS RESPONSE PROGRAM

- Grants to provide homeless prevention, rapid re-housing assistance as well as operating funds for emergency shelters.
 - Services include rental assistance and utility deposits to help move homeless individuals to permanent housing.
- Available to nonprofit organizations, local governments and public housing authorities that serve the housing needs of homeless people and those facing imminent homelessness.

SUPPORTIVE HOUSING PROGRAM

- Grants to reduce homelessness in Ohio and provide funding for transitional and permanent supportive housing.
 - Transitional housing can be provided in one structure or several structures at one site or in multiple structures at various sites.
- Available to nonprofit organizations, local governments, and public housing authorities that provide transitional housing to homeless families and permanent supportive housing for homeless disabled people.
 - Services are available to households at or below 35 percent of the area median income.

HOUSING OPPORTUNITIES FOR PERSONS WITH AIDS

- Grants to assist with meeting the housing and supportive service needs of low- and moderateincome people with AIDS or HIV-related diseases.
 - Services include tenant-based rental assistance, short-term rent, mortgage and utility assistance.
- Available to nonprofit organizations to assist with meeting the housing and supportive service needs of low- and moderate-income people with AIDS or HIVrelated diseases.
